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Abstract: The Universal Design for Learning (UDL) is a framework to improve and optimize teaching and learning for all people based on scientific insights into how humans learn. The paper presents research results on the Universal Design for Learning and its benefit for equity, diversity, and inclusion; the principles of UDL application and their applicability in marginalized classrooms; and reviews the main differences between traditional education and education based on UDL.
